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ICE Enterprises, Inc. continuously evaluates our suppliers used in the supply chain to ensure no “conflict materials” (as defined in Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street reform and Consumer Protection Act) are being used in our end product and their processes.

“Conflict Materials” are defined as materials mined from the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or any adjoining countries (DRC affiliated) in the manufacture of products, and include:

- Columbite-tantalite, also known as coltan (the metal ore from which tantalum is extracted).
- Cassiterite (the metal ore from which tin is extracted).
- Gold.
- Wolframite (the metal ore from which tungsten is extracted).
- Any other mineral or its derivatives as determined by the Secretary of State which provide financial support for conflict in the DRC Countries.

ICE Enterprises, Inc. demonstrates full support for this legislation, and is committed to providing a high-quality product that is free of any “conflict materials” being used throughout the assembly and manufacturing process. ICE Enterprises, Inc. does not directly purchase from mines, smelters, or refiners, and is typically removed from these activities. However, ICE Enterprises, Inc. does require that our suppliers that may purchase these raw materials have stringent requirements and are expected to purchase materials from a compliant source, as well as provide documentation stating the materials consumed are conflict-free.
